

Remembering

With much pride and joy, we are this year celebrating the first twenty-five years from foundation day of The Association of Lyceum Past Students. In the month of March 1994, founder president Dr. Guido Saliba, gathered around him a number of Liceo Past Students and decided that it was about time for a Lyceum Old Boys Association to be formed. The enthusiasm was not lacking at that time and Guido received much encouragement from the small crowd sitting in front of him. They all expressed their views and their wish to see the formation of an association that would keep alive the name of the best school in Malta. There were other attempts over the past years prior to that meeting, but nothing really materialized. Then, with Guido Saliba's dream coming to fruition, the ALPS started to function and enrolment of members began to take place. The early years were somewhat difficult. With much difficulty through word of mouth, the Association of Lyceum Past Students had started to function. Within the first year, there had been an encouraging members list which augured for strength in the years to come. The indefatigable founder President Dr. Saliba, was using his influence within the civil service as well as the legal circle to recruit many Lyceum ex-Alumni, into what had become known as ALPS. He was a lawyer and had many friends who were all giving a helping hand to recommend past Lyceum students for enrolment.

Lyceum Past Students, encountered many obstacles but with great determination, they have all been surmounted. The Lyceum motto "Nil Mediocriter" came to the fore and nothing could possibly stand in their way, when Lyceum ex-Alumni came together and started holding meetings and even organizing the first events for being together in many different activities. Things were much different at the early stages. 1994, was the year when many of us past Liceo Students still held jobs and could only afford little time for an old boys association. Nevertheless, we simply did not give up as we were all determined to make it work and become more and more popular within the Maltese Islands. Then of course came the time to spread our wings and explore beyond the Maltese shores, the possibility of recruiting ex-Liceo students into the ALPS fold. Success was immediate and with the help of two or three key persons, like Milo Vassallo in Canada, Oreste Aquilina

In its infancy, the Association of

in Australia and Fr. Felice Pace in the United States, more names had started to be added to the list of ALPS members. Guido was thrilled at the thought of seeing his dream flourish in such a short period of time. He wanted more and with a hard working council sitting with him at committee meetings, events were organized that also included family members who had started to attend for the functions. The first AGM saw the start of what had to become a most popular old boys association. Finances were low and many a time the council members had to dig in their pockets to make up for any shortfall in cash after a particular event took place and which could have incurred a greater expense than anticipated. This never bothered Guido and those around him at those early stages of ALPS. The writer wants to show the greatest respect for all those who have served on ALPS council of administration over the past years. Sacrifices were made and sometimes even at the expense of neglecting personal matters and work, as long as the association work was done and done properly. They all deserve much esteem and a very big thank you for the work they have carried out in order to ensure that The Association of Lyceum Past Students continued to march ahead irrespective of all obstacles that came in its way.

The years started to roll and The ALPS banner was drawn and prepared. The chosen design and colors had really made our association proud wherever it made its presence felt. That same banner still exists to this day and it has travelled to many parts of the world on organized trips beyond our shores. We are ever so proud to produce group photos sporting our ALPS banner in all our activities. The many positive comments that we receive, give us much courage for the future. Having said that, we can look back and recall the best times when the ALPS banner was carried to far away, Russia, Alaska, USA, Canada, Germany, Italy, France, Greece, and a number of other European countries.

The first ten years of ALPS were under the leadership of founder president Dr. Guido Saliba, between 1994 to 2004. It was only a few months before passing away, that Guido had decided to step down and pass the reigns of ALPS onto the then Deputy President. Things continued to progress in a most harmonious manner and he could sit next to acting President George Stagno Navarra, extending his wise

In December of that vear 2004, our much loved founder president passed and bequeathed to us all, a strong association that continued on the right path to this day. Needless to say, membership continued to increase over the past twenty-five years and we can very proudly announce today, that the number surpasses the nine hundred mark. Well done to all who have worked so hard within ALPS in making this association of ours, reach to greater heights year after year. Today, we are much respected and accepted within the Maltese society. The Association of Lyceum Past Students or better still as it is well known ALPS has really become a household name.

To talk about some of the best achievements over the past years, one can mention The Pwales chapel project that has given us so much satisfaction. We have taken under our care since the year 2000, the upkeep and maintenance of this quaint little wayside chapel in the limits of Xemxija St Paul's Bay. We are blessed with the services of a spiritual director Fr. William Bartolo, who is a wonderful ally to our association, by extending spiritual services to ALPS members, families and friends as well as the small Pwales community made up of farmers and hardworking people. We dedicate many hours of our time doing work inside this tiny chapel and preserving this heritage

for future generations. With much satisfaction, we have introduced to the Pwales hamlet, a number of VIPS like, The President of the Republic of Malta, various Arch Bishops, a Maltese Cardinal Prospero Grech and various other distinguished personalities who have all praised our work at this chapel. We allocate a good sum of money each year towards the upkeep of the Pwales Chapel and we are hoping, that we may continue to find the resources that will satisfy the needs cropping up each year.

Turning now to the numerous activities that are held each year in order to see more and more Liceo Past Students getting together. In a spirit of friendship for recalling old school memories. We have over the past years, organized cultural tours to various interesting historical sites around Malta and Gozo. Without fail, we prepare the Valentine's event in February of each year. The summer barbeque is another great event which attracts a good number of members and friends of ALPS and in a relaxed atmosphere, they all enjoy dining by the water's edge. Another popular activity each year is the Yuletide week-end, which is very well attended and the numbers keep surpassing those of previous years. We simply cannot grumble with attendance at such activities. On the contrary, many a time we worry that the chosen venue will not be large enough to hold us all. However, up to now we have always managed to accommodate everyone. For a

few years ALPS had its own choir and under the leadership of past council member Joseph Fenech, concerts had been organized and have attracted wide audiences in any activity that was put up. At Christmas time the ALPS choir used to pay visits to old people's homes and institutions, bringing a smile to those who are now confined and dependent on the help afforded to them at such institutions. Besides the choir, for a few years the association also encouraged another initiative called 'Dance to Health' keeping in mind the best exercise for mind and body of all members and friends of ALPS

ALPS looks after the spiritual side of life and the annual retreat that had been initiated by Guido Saliba at the Manresa House in Gozo, continues to be a great hit. All rooms at this retreat home are taken up each year. There were occasions when we even had to find alternative additional accommodation to cater for a much larger number of retreat participants. The chosen speakers keep all those who attend very alert, listening to sermons and discussions about varying subjects that interest us all.

Travelling abroad is a fantastic manner to enjoy the best in life. For a good number of years, the Association of Lyceum Past Students organized many trips abroad. Some were in the form of land tours and some as ship cruises plying from one country to another whilst admiring the scenery and mixing with people of different cultures. Language is not really a barrier during these tours.

The little that we have learned at the Liceo, continues to assist us in getting along by speaking some French, Italian and English. Some Lyceum boys have studied and graduated in other languages too. Reunions have been held twice in Toronto Canada and many a tear could be seen running down the cheeks of Lyceum past students who come together after a good number of years. Distance is not a barrier between Lyceum comrades. Nostalgic thoughts of past episodes are very vividly recounted at such reunions in Malta and even abroad. This is the spirit of camaraderie that has run in our veins since the days when we lived together in the same classrooms of the Lyceum. The war may have temporarily disturbed the school years for some of the past students who have experienced the enemy attacks during battle. On the other hand, there was the will in every student to carry on and study and graduate, even if running from one village to another in makeshift schools that had been made available during those turbulent times. Where there is a will there is a way and many learned scholars obtained distinguished degrees that have made them famous in their individual careers in life, all thanks to the teachings at The Lyceum. Presidents of Malta, Cardinal, Archbishops & Bishops, Judges, Magistrates, Lawyers, Professors of Medicine & Law, Architects, Draftsmen, Priests and Monks, Teachers and University Lecturers, Heads within the Civil Service, Ambassadors outside the Maltese Islands, successful and renowned businessmen, Accountants & Auditors, IT Technicians and famous Engineers and many other trades, all came out of the 'Liceo ta' Malta u Ghawdex.

We are this year celebrating with much pomp, our twenty-fifth anniversary from foundation date of ALPS. Looking back at the difficulties that we have had to encounter and the many joys that have come our way over this quarter of a century, we can only say that it was worth the effort in keeping alive this old boys association. 
