He simply loved to be with his Lyceum comrades. The last grand event that we are proud of, was the celebration of Holy Mass at St John's Co-Cathedral Valetta during March 2019 on the occasion of a 25th Anniversary Celebration from foundation date of ALPS. Always a great honor for us to have His Eminence with us and we all treasure some nice memories of his gentle jokes that he shared and narratives from his younger years at The Lyceum Malta.
