
of Lyceum Past Students, that is here to serve all of you members and friends in ALPS. "Thank you, Robbie "

A Past Liceo Student Writes:

'My Days at the Lyceum'

In early sixties, I sat for two separate examinations in order to attend a Government secondary school, either the Lyceum or the Technical School in Paola, also known as Iz-Zoo. The exam consisted of one paper in English and one in Mathematics. The Lyceum was then considered to be by far the best school in Malta, surpassing also the St. Aloysius and St. Edwards private secondary schools. First result out was for entrance to the Technical School which I passed. A few days later, I also passed the Lyceum entrance exam and obviously that was my parents' best choice. Come October of that year, I found myself in Hamrun, not in Valletta where there were also some classes for new Lyceum entrants. I was

eleven years old and already a keen football player, so I was very glad that the school had a very large football pitch and recreation area to stay in during our lunch break.

During my five years at the Lyceum (1960-1965), I had some very good teachers some of whom I still remember for some reason or other. Il-Kanonku Schriha; Mr. Buttigieg (II-Hambaq); II-Minus One, Fr Joe Bugeja; Il-Giglu, another priest who taught us history. Then we had Joe Borg Cardona (II-Pahwi) who taught us French. Our math's teacher, Mr. Frisk who always wore an open collar and no tie but delivered a fine lesson and was quite popular. Another maths teacher Mr. Tonna (It-Tokyo) who came from Floriana and used to tease me because I sided with Sliema

Wanderers and many others like Captain Sicklemore (Physics), Ivo Galea (II-Bufula), J.B. Cassar who taught us chemistry, (a subject which I used to hate), Mr. Galea (II-Baby Face), John Camilleri (II-Pipi) who was also in charge of the school tuck shop, Mr. Miller and Mr. Scerri who were our sports masters, and many others.

The headmaster of the Lyceum in my days was Mr. Thomas Glass with his two assistants, Mr. Victor Bisazza whom I remember was always with a pipe in his hand and Mr. John Grima who was quite a disciplinarian As I said in the beginning, I was always keen on football and played for the Lyceum team at all levels. After a few years, Mr. Abela (II-Pullu), made me school football captain and involved me in organizing various football competitions between

classes. I remember going around the classes giving out the team football jerseys when I was supposed to be in my class listening to the lectures. I was also assisted by two school janitors who also liked football, Maurice from Cospicua and Guseppi from Hamrun. My proudest moment was when in my last year, the Lyceum first team won the secondary schools trophy by beating the Technical School at the old Schreiber ground by four goals to one and I was then presented with the trophy by the then Minister of Education, Mr. Paris to the cheers of the many Lyceum students who came to watch the final.

It was only when I finished my five-year term at the Lyceum that I realized how lucky and happy I was to have attended at this wonderful school.

The Lyceum Scout Group - Part IV

The Lyceum Scout Group was re-opened in July 1991 following the initiative of Dr Guido Saliba the A.L.P.S. founder. He contacted the Island Head Quarters of the Scout Association of Malta about his idea and three leaders were assigned: GSL. Mr. Kenneth Cassar Torregiani, Skipper Mr. Alex Bonello, and Mr. Godwin D'Anastasi as Treasurer. Following a recruitment drive at the Lyceum, there were 18 boys who applied and started attending the troop meetings every Friday; the first one being 5th July 1991.

With the co-operation of the Headmaster, Mr G. Grech, and the Heads of School to date, the Lyceum Scout Quarters is situated at the Lyceum Premises beneath the Science Laboratories. There were four Patrols: the Eagle, Falcon, Hawk and Kestrel - holding their first summer camp in August 1991 at the IHQ in Floriana. On 7th December 1991 there was the first investiture at the School Hall with

a new scarf carrying the school badge with the old colours - blue as background trimmed with gold. The first GSL of the old group Mr Paul Abela was present for this event.

It was Dr Saliba's wish that the Lyceum Scout Group became an affiliated member of A.L.P.S. having a representative at the Association's Council of Administration and since then, Lyceum Scouts have always participated and helped in ALPS events.

Regular activities include games, hike expeditions, swimming, biking, abseiling, cooking, canoeing and camping. The group has its own chaplain, Fr William Bartolo who says Mass at campsite during Christmas, Easter and Summer

holidays. Through our chaplain the group was assigned to hold camps and weekend meetings at St Anne's Chapel in Pwales, when this picturesque chapel was handed over to ALPS, as maintenance was beyond our means. In fact ALPS made a good job in doing a major restoration, in collaboration with the St Paul's Bay Parish Church and the Restoration Directorate.

The group continued to grow and the venture unit was also established with members over the age of 15 years. Even the cub section was opened; but this section was short-lived. We were also active in helping in the annual Bike Marathon organised by the school. We also acted as marshals

and at water stations in the Malta Marathon held every February. Needless to say the group always participated in the annual parade for St George's day which took place in April/May in Floriana and Valletta. Apart from the routine scouting the group took part in various jamborees in Malta as well as abroad such as Sigonella in Sicily, Poland, Kandersteg International Scout Centre in Switzerland, and Iceland.

In July 2001 and August 2011 we celebrated the 10th and 20th Anniversaries and a commemorative plaque was inaugurated at the entrance of our HQ. The Group is still active but sometimes struggling to get new members. Today there are female students at the Lyceum and we have female members attending the scout group. The group is also planning to introduce the Beavers and the Cub Sections.

The first Group Scout Leader was Mr Kenneth Cassar Torregiani who resigned in 1995 and Mr Alex Bonello took over for 20 years. In 2015 Mr Mark Darmanin was assigned as the new Group Scout Leader of the Lyceum Group - he started as a scout way back in 1991 when the group re-opened.

and often strictly limited to the sports field, that for many years factually existed between the Lyceum and St. Aloysius College. Indeed both institutions then even competed with and against also St. Edward's College, for example in drama, mastery of use of English, and naturally sport.

From a purely historical interpretation aspect your

interesting article sort of makes a case of such then (i.e. in the 1950s and later) existing rivalry not being at all reasonably founded because, in a way, we are all branches from the same tree, viz the Jesuits'/ National Governing were originating source.

Response from the ALPS President:

I have been reading very carefully the feedback through John Consiglio a Liceo Past Student 1950/56. His valued contribution is very much appreciated.

This gives me much pleasure to note, that all that is presented in the ALPS News Letter is followed by our readers. Hence the write-ups that are addressed to us after each issue. Such follow-ups can perhaps be a means of improving if need be, on what we already have.

Regarding the article presented in the last edition, I would like to

refer the writer to a very detailed write-up in a printed edition of Chanticleer magazine of 2005 and which was prepared by Fr. Anton Azzopardi S.J. Pages 19 and 20 of that article clearly explained that when the Jesuits first arrived in Malta in 1592, they had come to respond to the wish of the Bishop and the Grand Master and open a college for the education of youth.

The principal fomenter and promoter of the Jesuit college, was Bishop Gargallo. After long discussion between Grand Master

De Verdalle and Bishop Gargallo on one hand, and the General of the Jesuits Fr. Claudio Aqua Viva on the other, the Deed of Foundation of the Jesuit college was solemnly signed in Valletta on the 12th November 1592 by the Grand Master, the Bishop and Fr. Pietro Casati. This goes to show the very close connection that had existed from the very beginning, with the start of the Collegium Melitense which prospered for over two hundred years.

This was closed down with the expulsion of the Jesuits in 1768.

Thirty years later, the effect of Napoleonic and French interlude on Maltese education, was described as being catastrophic. By Napoleon's edict of 18th June 1798, the University and Lyceum were closed and had been substituted by an Ecole Centrale that was modeled on the schools in Paris.

Dr. Guido Saliba ALPS founding President, had also referred in his write-up shown in another study about the origins of Lyceum, in a previous edition of Chanticleer magazine year 2002.

As part of ALPS program to honor past Lyceum teachers I met eighty-one-year-old John Camillieri (IL-PIPI) who is a permanent resident at the Holy Family Home in Naxxar. He is Sliema born and was educated at the local Primary school and later on at the Lyceum. Inclined to pursue a religious vocation he attended the local Jesuit institute and was referred to Rome to study Theology and Philosophy at the Gregorian College. Regrettably, after five years he gave up religious studies and returned to Malta. In 1956 he was employed as a Lyceum teacher teaching mathematics. When Dr Paul Heywood LLD

terminated his headmastership, John Camilleri had assumed the additional role of managing the Lyceum and also lecturing at the Royal University of Malta in his special subject philosophy. From the Education department he applied for a transfer to the Police and was appointed Director of the Civil Prison.

After a number of years in this onerous job he was appointed Personal Secretary to both Presidents Vincent Tabone FRCS and to Dr Ugo Mifsud Bonnici LLD.

On reaching retiring age in 1995 he pursued the hobbies of woodworking and metal work. When this activity came to the attention of the late missionary Fr George Grima, John was encouraged to help

out embellishing the newly established mission stations in various countries situated in South America and Africa.

Among his African visits he counts long periods spent in Kenya, Tanzania and Ethiopia and feels proud that after his training, the locals excelled in the art of construction and thus set up workshops earning a good living.

Even nowadays at the Holy Family Home, John Camilleri continues to keep himself occupied by manning the switchgear and answering in-coming phone calls, besides attending also to light jobs and helping the administration running the Home.

The sky opened and the rain poured down, washing the thin


paint from all over the church and knocking Jack off the scaffold to land on the lawn.
