


News from Kappella Sant'Anna - Pwales St Paul's Bay



Drama at the Lyceum and Cyril Parker

One of the ALPS members Dr. John Consiglio, dedicated some of his time to write and send to us this interesting write-up about drama.

Quite some time ago I was extremely pleased to read the item "Reporting about the Lyceum, Youth Theatre", by Dr. Nazarene Azzopardi in a very interesting recent issue of the ALPS NewsLetter. During my forms Three to Six at The Lyceum between 1953 and 1956 I was active in that Theatre, and there is indeed much that can and must be said about it.

If, at around start of the school year in October, one would have even as much as shown half an interest in the schools' plays, Mr. Cyril Parker our Headmaster would immediately book all one's lunch breaks and all one's Saturday mornings for rehearsals. Woe and betide anyone missing any rehearsal, even if one's part was in fact not being rehearsed at all during that day. When, feeling capricious, I once missed attending a Saturday morning rehearsal and went off to play football at the San Girgor Catholic Action Centre in Villa Schinas in Sliema, my younger brother came rushing to me there pleading "John please come quick back home because the Headmaster is there, and he's hopping mad." Indeed Mr. Parker had taken a taxi from the school in Valletta to come over to my house and fetch me, and when I got there his admonishing voice blared loudly "Is this the way to treat your old headmaster?". And he dragged me off to Valletta for the day's rehearsal in the hired taxi! But this was a Headmaster who really knew what was good

for the boys and the school. When, for the Lyceum's annual Shakespeare play, he would always choose the one that would in that year be featuring in the Oxford examinations syllabus, he would not only be teaching drama with all its beauty to the participating boys, but he would also be assuring for the school the island's highest percentage of successes in the Oxford English Literature exams.

Under his tutelage I participated – and ended up knowing the whole play from cover to cover – in "A Midsummer's Night Dream". I played Helena in that production, and that was the first time I ever got on to a stage. In the following year I played Malvolio in Twelfth Night (and I really made the rafters at the old Knights Hall roar with laughter). After that I played Macduff in "Macbeth", a play which later I had the honour to explain in depth to Malta's great tenor Joseph Calleja, at his house in Attard months before his debut in that opera at the Astra Theatre in Gozo. In our Lyceum Drama Group actors who later were to become famous in Malta's theatre scene included Narcy Calamatta, Arnold Sultana, Hugh Holland, and many others.

Mr. Parker would plan to have the Lyceum play run for a whole week. And after that week he used to also take us all to put the show up at the Salesian Oratory in Gozo, where the productions were always jam packed. His generosity to us on those trips, with sweets, drinks, food, even as he chain-smoked endlessly, was unique. Cyril Parker really loved his students, and he really deserves a place of great honour in the history of education in Malta.
